I am innocent of aggravated assault and aggravated burglary committed on May 28, 1995 at 4:45am. The victim was Pepper Winstead age 36 years.

It took place at 1010 Chestnut Dr, a single-family residence in Portage county, Wisconsin with a population of 70,000.

The victim, Pepper Winstead, is age 36. Allen Colgate age 28, was convicted of the crime.

The victim woke suddenly to find a man standing over her bed. The man grabbed the victim and put a knife to her throat. The man pulled the victim out of bed and dragged her to her office. The man forced the victim to open a locked desk. The victim hit her head and knee when the assailant pushed her into the bookshelf near the window. The victim then grabbed the knife and struggled with the assailant. The victim stabbed the assailant in the right shoulder with the knife and he jumped out the window. On the way out the window, the assailant got stuck in the mini-blinds. The assailant left blood all over the blinds and on the floor in front of the window.

The victim initially described the assailant as a man wearing short-sleeved shirt and shorts. Did not mention or describe any tattoos. Allen Colgate has large tattoos on both arms, including a 31/2 inch tattoo of his name. Also Allen Colgate does not have any stab wounds on his shoulders or any other part of his body. The blood did match my blood type but no other testing was done.
